Curriculum

- Bowling Green High School offers honors, accelerated and advanced placement, college preparatory curriculum, dual enrollment and pre-vocational general courses.
- Penta Career Center offers over 30 junior and senior skill areas for job training, as well as hosting a Sophomore Exploratory program.
- Post Secondary Options is a program available to eligible students who wish to enroll in college courses for high school and/or college credit.

Core Classes *(for details see Course Descriptions and Selection Guide)*

English

All students must complete English 9, 10 and 11.
Other Electives include: , Honors courses, AP English, and World Culture Studies.

Social Studies

Must complete World History, American History, U.S. Government, and Economics.
Other Electives include: Honors courses, Geography, American Culture Studies, Geopolitics, Contemporary Issues, World Culture Studies.

Science

Must complete Science 9, Honors Science 9, and Regular/Honors Biology/One additional credit beyond Biology.
Other Electives include: Chemistry, AP Chemistry, Anatomy and Physiology, Geophysical Science, College Physics and Field Biology.

Math

Choose between Regular or Honors courses.
Basic classes: Algebra, Geometry, Algebra II/Trig, Algebra III with Trigonometry, Calculus and Honors Pre-Calculus, Intermediate Algebra, Stats/Functions.

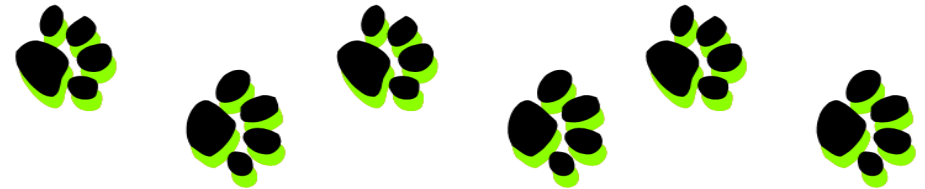

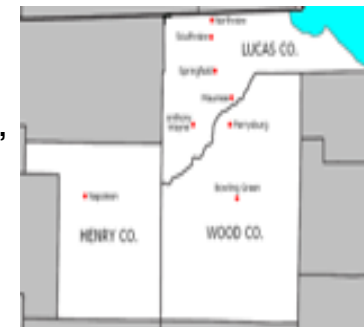
Quiz Bowl
